(Lincoln County Cooperative Extension Office)

Cathi Blair, Ky DOT

- USDOT has in-lieu stream mitigation fees to contribute to projects within the Dix River Watershed, especially due to the impact of constructing US150 from Mt. Vernon

Tony White, Mercer County Health Department

- Mercer County formed sanitation district, have better potential for sewer line extension to properties surrounding the lake

Heath Stone, Garrard County Health Department

- Bluegrass Pride could really help them out by providing grants to homeowners for replacing failing septic systems with new drainfields. Cluster system grants not as helpful.

Donnie Gooch, Lincoln County landowner

- Stanford WWTP disposes of their sludge on land adjacent to the Dix River, have been doing so for about 20 years. (On Gooch Road, off of Goshen Road)

Linda Alexander, Herrington Lake Conservation League

- Need to enforce houseboat regulations regarding sewage. Marina pumpout stations seldomly used. Also, are outhouses on boat docks.

Jane Van Hook, Garrard County High School

- Need to emphasize watershed education in high schools of all four counties in Dix River Watershed (Mercer, Lincoln, Garrard and Boyle)
